A new Vocational study option at Public FET Colleges

Public FET Colleges now offer a new, exciting, modern and relevant range of vocational programmes known as the National Certificate (Vocational). These vocational programmes are high skills, high quality and high knowledge programmes introduced at FET Colleges nationally in 2007 and are intended to directly respond to the priority skills demands of the modern economy.

What is the National Certificate (Safety in Society) Qualification?

The National Certificate (Safety in Society) is a new qualification at each of Levels 2, 3 and 4 of the NQF. This qualification is designed to provide both the theory and practice of safety in security. The practical component of study may be offered in a real workplace environment or in a simulated experience workplace environment. It will provide students with an opportunity to experience work situations during the period of study.

What are the minimum entry requirements to the Qualification?

For entry into the National Certificate (Safety in Society) at NQF Level 2, you require:

- A year end school report for Grade 9 or higher; or
- An NQF Level 1 qualification; or
- An approved bridging programme designed for the specific purpose to access NQF Level 2; or
- A Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) assessment to meet the basic requirements for access to NQF Level 2.

How long is the Qualification?

The National Certificate (Safety in Society) qualification is a full year programme at each of the NQF levels of study. A student is issued with a certificate on the successful completion of each level of study, that is level 2, 3 and Level 4. Therefore the full qualifications is three years in duration.

Which subjects make up a National Certificate (Safety in Society)

In order to obtain a National Certificate (Safety in Society), a student is required to take a total of 7 subjects. These include 3 fundamental subjects and 4 vocational subjects.

The 3 fundamental subjects are:

- Language - which must be the language of teaching and learning;
- Mathematics or Mathematical Literacy; and
- Life Orientation

What are the Vocational subjects in Safety in Society?

The vocational subjects in Safety in Society are:

- Governance
- Criminal Law and procedure
- Criminal Justice System
- Policing Practice
- Criminology

These subjects offered at each of the different NQF Levels of study in the National Certificate (Safety in Society) qualification.

What vocational activities would this give you access to?

The holder of the National Certificate (Safety in Society) will be able to:

- Join the policing services e.g. South African Police Services (SAPS), Metropolitan Agencies (Metro Police), Traffic Agencies and the Military Police Division.
- Join the Private Security Services e.g. Security Management, Community Policing
- Join the National Statutory Intelligence Agencies
